PLAYING REGULATIONS – WOMEN’S FIELD HOCKEY

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1. COMPETITION

1.1. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The U SPORTS Women’s Invitational Field Hockey Championship shall have a total of eight (8) games taking place over four (4) days. There will be four (4) teams in a one pool round robin format. The top two (2) teams advance to the gold medal game, while the bottom two teams play for bronze.

1.2. TEAMS

The participating teams for the **2025** Championship will be as follows:

- OUA Champion
- CW Champion
- Atlantic League Representative
- Atlantic League Representative (Host)

2.1 SELECTION, SEEDING, DRAW, POOLS, TRIALS AND HEATS

2.1.1 SEEDING CRITERIA

The seeding will be based on the results of the **2024** Championship.

2.1.2 SEEDING FOR **2025**

1. CW #1
2. OUA #1
3. Atlantic League Champion
4. Atlantic League (Host)

2.1.3 FORMULAS AND FORMAT

Thursday*	1 vs 2 (4:00pm)	3 vs 4 (6:30pm)
Friday	1 vs 3 (4:00pm)	2 vs 4 (6:30pm)
Saturday	1 vs 4 (12:30pm)	2 vs 3 (3pm)
Sunday	Bronze (10:30am)	Gold (1:00pm)

* **Host may choose** to play in the late game on Thursday, regardless of seeding.

* Game times are at the discretion of the host (see section 1.6)



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2.2 PROCEDURES AND PROTESTS

If a team wishes to lodge a protest at the end of the game, its team representative must:

- Declare the intention to do so immediately in writing directly below their signature when signing the Match Report
- In addition, produce in writing the grounds of the protest and submit the protest to the Technical Official or Technical Delegate on duty, within fifteen (15) minutes of the end of the game
- Provide a deposit of \$40.00 within those additional fifteen (15) minutes.

If the team representative fails to do any of these, the protest shall be considered void. This protest deposit shall be refunded unless the protest is deemed a futile one by the Championship Management Committee. The Host institution keeps any moneys received from protests.

A protest from a decision made by an Umpire or Technical Official during a match or shoot-out competition may not be made to or considered by the Technical Delegate.

A team may protest about any decision of the Technical Delegate under the regulations or application of the U SPORTS and/or FIH Rules and FIH Regulations.

2.2.1 INTERRUPTION(S) OF MATCHES

Prior to the beginning of the match, the Tournament Technical Director will decide if the game will start. If the game is already underway, and the Umpires decide to interrupt a match (e.g. because of pitch conditions or atmospheric conditions) that match shall be resumed as soon as possible; not necessarily on the same pitch, nor under the following conditions

1. The match must be completed up to the agreed full time; the score on the resumption being the one standing at the time the interruption took place
2. On resumption, regulations related to the substitution of players shall apply as though there had been no interruption to the match.

2.2.2 FAILURE TO PLAY

During the round robin matches, a team refusing to play or to complete a match in its program shall be considered as scratching from the competition. If a team scratches from competition, all matches it had played up until then shall be considered void, not only by the team scratching, but also by all teams it had played. The classification of teams shall be corrected accordingly.



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2.2.3 ADMISSION ON TO THE FIELD OF PLAY

No one, except the players and the umpires properly engaged in a given match, may enter the field of play during the match, unless she/he is invited to do so by an umpire or has obtained prior authorization from an umpire. This rule is compulsory even in the event of an injury to a player or to an umpire.

The Host Organization must provide a trainer (physiotherapist/athletic therapist) on site and ice for the duration of the event.

In such an event, only the registered team medical doctor and physiotherapist/athletic therapist will be authorized by the umpires to come onto the pitch to assist and/or remove any incapacitated player on their team. In the event of a team not having one or both persons registered on the entry form **the Host Organization's onsite trainer shall enter the pitch to assist and remove the incapacitated player.**

2.3 SCHEDULES OR ORDER OF EVENTS

Tuesday – Teams Arrive

Wednesday – Team practices, Technical Meeting, Awards Event

Thursday – Game #1 & Game #2

Friday – Game #3 & Game #4

Saturday – Game #5 & Game #6

Sunday – Bronze Medal Game & Gold Medal Game

2.4 GAME TIME

The final schedule is at the discretion of the Host Committee working in consultation with Field Hockey Canada and the U SPORTS Office.

A match shall consist of a regulation time of four quarters of 15 minutes each, separated by an interval of 2 minute. The halftime duration will be 10 minutes.

2.5 PRACTICE TIMES / WARM-UPS

Teams will be given one 90-minute block of practice time

Practice Slot #1 – 9:00-10:30am

Practice Slot #2 – 10:30-12:00pm

Practice Slot #3 – 12:00-1:30pm

Practice Slot #4 – 1:30-3:00pm



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Consideration will be given to teams traveling from away (i.e. if the U Sports Invitational Championship is in the East, the teams from the West will train in the last two practice slots).

2.6 OVERTIME, TIMEOUTS & TIE-BREAKING

Should there be an unforeseen delay in a previous match, there will be a minimum of 20 minutes for warm-up on the game field prior to the next match of the championship.

2.7 SCORING AND STANDARDS

2.7.1 CLASSIFICATION IN THE POOL

At the end of the round robin games, the total number of points accumulated in pool shall determine team placing. The following shall be awarded for each round robin game:

1. Three (3) points for a win
2. One (1) point for a tie
3. Zero (0) points for a loss.

2.7.2 TIME KEEPING

Time keeping is controlled by the Technical Official on duty. They are responsible for signaling the end of each period. If a match, however, is prolonged at the end of a quarter to allow for the completion of a penalty corner as specified in the Rules of Hockey, the umpires will signal the end of the quarter.

2.7.3 SCOREKEEPING

Scorekeeping will be responsibility of the Technical Official on duty. The goal scorer, type of goal, and time of each goal must be recorded.

2.7.4 TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES IN POOL PLAY (as per 10.1 Appendix 1)

2.7.5 GOLD and BRONZE MEDAL MATCHES

Each game shall be played through to a result. A tie in score at the end of regulation time will result in a shootout to decide a winner. Shoot out procedure will take place as per FIH regulations.

3 CHAMPIONSHIP ROSTER

- 3.1 Each championship team can declare and dress up to eighteen (18) players, two of which must be goalkeepers, from their most recently submitted U SPORTS Eligibility Form at the Pre-Championship technical meeting. **If a team chooses to not include a second goalkeeper in the 18 players, they are limited to using 17 players for the duration of the event. If one of the goalkeepers becomes injured or is suspended during the event, that team can continue to use 17 players including only 1**



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goalkeeper. No changes/additions can be made to this list once submitted.

3.2 The Host Organizing Committee will supply a form to each Head Coach for each game, with a list of the already declared eighteen (18) players.

3.3 GAME DAY ROSTERS

3.3.1 Coaches must complete the Match Report to declare their starting athletes and the four (4) bench staff to the Technical Official 60 minutes prior to the start of the game.

3.3.2 The team representative must sign off on the final game sheet at the end of the match.

4 TEAM BENCH

A team can have a maximum of 22 team members (maximum 18 athletes and four (4) team staff) in the team bench area for the duration of the match. The four (4) declared team staff cannot be changed once declared prior to the match.

The team representative (manager) for the match must identify themselves and be seated on the end of the bench closest to the technical table during the match.

The bench area is restricted to the official championship roster. No other personnel will be allowed in the designated area for the duration of the match. No member of the championship roster will be allowed to leave the designated area without the permission of the technical table.

Note: Any team member, above the 22, is considered a spectator and will sit in the stands.

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5 EQUIPMENT AND FACILITY

5.1 BALL

The Host institution for the U SPORTS/FHC Championship will use white, FIH approved competition field hockey balls.

5.2 RECORDING OF GAMES

5.2.1 GAME FILM

1. FIRST ROUND OPPONENT (N/A)
2. HOST REQUIREMENT

The Host must record all games at the Invitational Championship and provide the recordings to each participating team and the assigned Technical Delegate at the conclusion of each match and no later than 90 minutes after the final whistle.

5.3 UNIFORMS

Teams must travel to the Championship with two sets of uniforms and socks: one light set and one dark set.

Goalkeeper jerseys must be a different colour than the field players’ dark and light jerseys.

Goalkeeper and player uniforms must be shown at the pre-championship technical meeting.

5.3.1 U SPORTS LOGO

U SPORTS reserve the right to require participants in a U SPORTS Invitational Championship to wear a U SPORTS logo on their uniforms. These logos will be provided to each team in advance of the championship. The logo must be placed on the top, right chest area of each uniform.

5.3.2 CORPORATE LOGOS



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5.3.3 NUMBERING

Player uniforms must be numbered, the numbers to be six inches high on the player’s backs. Goalkeeper's uniforms must be numbered on the front as well as the back.

A player cannot wear the same number as another player on the same team.

5.4 SHORTS, SOCKS, BRACES, EQUIPMENT & DRESS CODE

1. The Technical Delegate will assign uniform colors for each game during the technical meeting. Each team shall carry two different sets of uniforms to each match in case of any unforeseen color conflicts.
2. If a long sleeve shirt is worn under a light-colored short sleeve, then it must be light in color. If a long sleeve shirt is worn under a dark-colored short sleeve shirt, then it must be dark in color.
3. No shorts are to be obvious under the playing skirt when a player stands or generally plays the ball except for compression and/or core shorts.
4. Goalkeeper's uniforms must be different in color to both teams. Black should be avoided during night games, where possible.
5. In the case where an individual athlete or members of the team wear tights, all team members need to be in the same color of tights. Compression/core shorts are an exception. Tights must be worn under shin guards and socks.

5.5 HEAD GEAR AND HELMETS

Caps with hard peaks are not permitted.

5.6 CAPTAINS IDENTIFICATION

The captains of each team shall be identified by wearing a captain’s band.

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5.9 FACILITY REQUIREMENTS

5.9.1 Wherever possible, the Championship shall be played on **water based or artificial turf**.

5.9.2 Wherever possible, football goal posts should be completely removed so as not to be visible in the vicinity of the field of play, or at the very least, they be removed if they interfere with the field of play.

5.9.3 Music can only be played before the games and a half time for all games at the Championship.

5.9.4 Five (5) balls will be used at the Championship. Four (4) ball people will be used to assist with keeping the ball in play (2 per sideline). Cones may be used in lieu of ball persons where appropriate. **The Host Organization must declare this at the pre-championship technical meeting with the visiting team’s approval.**

6 RULES

The U SPORTS Invitational Championship will be played following FIH General Tournament Regulations Outdoor Competitions (May 2025) and the FIH Rules of Hockey (effective from January 1, 2022).

6.1 MATCH TIMING

6.1.1 Time will not stop when a Field Goal or Penalty Corner goal are scored.

6.1.2 Time will stop following the award of a Penalty Corner and Penalty Stroke.

6.1.3 When an initial penalty corner is awarded, the timing of the match shall be stopped for 40 seconds, (inter alia to permit defenders to put on protective gear etc) before allowing the penalty corner to commence. It is mandatory for all field players defending a penalty corner to use a face mask (as described in Rule 4.2 of the Rules of Hockey) until the penalty corner is completed (as described in Rule 13.5 of the Rules of Hockey). The engaged Umpire shall advise both the defence and the attackers as the countdown clock approaches zero. After 40 seconds if both teams are ready the Umpire shall re-start play by blowing the whistle and the ball shall be injected immediately or very shortly thereafter. If a team is not ready, the engaged Umpire has to determine:

A. If the delay was due to players finding and putting on their full protective equipment



(The priority for the Umpires is player safety and welfare, and therefore if a little more time is required for all defenders to be ready and fully protected, this should be given without penalty); OR

- B. If there was an intentional delay due to a defending player refusing to put on the face mask in appropriate time, resulting in a team not being ready within aforesaid 40 seconds.

The Umpire is to identify and issue a personal penalty (i.e. a green card) to the player who is responsible for the deliberate delay. If the same defending team repeats this similar offence there will be an increased personal penalty (i.e. a yellow card).

Consequence of Green Card for an intentional delay of defending team: The defending team defends the Penalty Corner with one less player (player who delayed).

- C. Where a defending player removes the face mask before the penalty corner is completed, the penalty corner shall be re-taken.

Where a delay is caused by an attacking player, the Umpire may issue a personal penalty (a green card) to the player concerned whilst at the same time reversing the award of the Penalty Corner, with a free hit out.

Repeat offence: an increased personal penalty (i.e. yellow card) may be issued for a repeat offence by the same attacking player.

7 MEETINGS

7.1 TECHNICAL MEETING

A Technical meeting will be held in person on the Wednesday before the start of a U SPORTS Invitational Championship. Time of the meeting is at the discretion of the Host Organizing Committee.

The Head Coach from each participating team, the Technical Director, and members of the Host Committee must attend this meeting.

7.2 COACHES MEETING (N/A)



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8 OFFICIALS

8.1 FUNDED OFFICIALS

The Championship will have a compliment of one (1) Technical Delegate, one (1) Umpires Manager, one (1) Technical Official, and four (4) Umpires, all to be assigned by Field Hockey Canada. All officials will be funded by Field Hockey Canada.

8.2 OFFICIALS ASSIGNMENT (N/A)

8.3 QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICIALS

All umpires must have a **Canadian** or **Regional certification**, where possible. If possible, all umpires must have umpired at a FHC Tournament or, if possible, umpired a minimum of two (2) Sport Conference games during that fall season.

8.4 HOST RESPONSIBILITIES

All teams are responsible for booking and paying for their own accommodations, meals and transportation as needed. If requested, the Host is responsible for working with the visiting teams to secure accommodation and onsite ground transportation.

8.5 NSO RESPONSIBILITIES

To arrange and cover the cost of travel, accommodation, per diems and game fees for the Technical Delegate and officials.

8.6 FEES

Official fees will be covered by Field Hockey Canada.

8.7 SELECTION PROCESS

All Umpires (CW, OUA, & Atlantic Region) will be asked to indicate their availability for the U SPORTS Invitational Championship 6 weeks prior to the event. The FHC Officials Committee will make the final appointments, and the names of appointees will be forwarded to the Host at least two weeks prior to the event.



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8.8 ON-SITE OFFICIALS ASSIGNMENT (N/A)

9 SEASON AND CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

**Please refer to policy 60.20 for more details re standard championship awards.*

9.1 ALL-STARS

- 9.1.1 Each Sport Conference and Atlantic Region shall designate an Awards Chair. The name of this individual shall be sent to the Field Hockey Coaches Association Awards Chair, who will then liaise with each designate to arrange the time and date of the conference call.
- 9.1.2 The Sport Conference Awards Chairs will determine, through their Sport Conference procedures, the top 11 ranked All-Stars in their Sport Conference.
- 9.1.3 The awards conference call will take place on the Tuesday - nine days prior to the Championship. The nomination must be returned to the Host Organizing Committee two (2) weeks prior to the championship.
- 9.1.4 During the awards conference call, the Awards Chairperson, in conjunction with the Sport Conference designates, will select, out of a pool of athletes (11 athletes from each of the 2 Sport Conferences plus Atlantic League athletes), the First Team All-Canadians. Note: One goalkeeper will be recognized. The top 2 ranked players (4 total) from each Sport Conference will automatically be selected for the First Team All-Canadians. The remaining 7 players will be selected according to the following criteria:
1. Statistics for the year (e.g. goals, assists, goals against average)
 2. Overall impact on the game.
 3. Importance to their university team; and
 4. Team Leadership qualities.

9.2 OUTSTANDING PLAYER OF THE YEAR (LIZ HOFFMAN AWARD)

9.2.1 Sport Conference MVP: The Sport Conference Player of the Year will be selected by the Sport Conference Coaches.

9.2.2 The names of the Sport Conference Players of the Year shall be forwarded to the host committee.

- a. The Awards Chairs shall rank the three nominees
- b. The player with the most 1st place votes shall be the winner.



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9.3 ROOKIE OF THE YEAR (JOYCE SLIPP AWARD)

9.3.1 Should a rookie player be selected to the All-Star Team, she will automatically be selected as Rookie of the Year. If there are two such players, the award will go to the highest ranked of the eligible rookies. If there is no rookie selected, the following procedure will apply:

Each Sport Conference is responsible for submitting a nomination for the Rookie of the Year. Sport Conference Chairpersons would be responsible for bringing this name forward to the Awards Committee.

Based on the following criteria, the selection for the Rookie of the Year would take place during the Awards Conference Call.

1. Nominees must be under the age of 21 as of September 1st and be in their 1st year of U SPORTS eligibility.
2. Statistics for the year (goals, goals against);
3. Overall impact on the game.
4. Importance to their university team; and
5. Team leadership qualities.
6. To win the National award the athlete must have won the Rookie of the Year award in their Sport Conference, if such an award exists

9.4 STUDENT-ATHLETE COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD (GAIL WILSON AWARD)

9.4.1 Awarded to the player who is selected by her teammates for best exemplifying the following characteristics:

- A person of exceptional human qualities who puts the needs of her team and her teammates first and who consistently demonstrates respect, kindness, and concern for others.
- A player who continually demonstrates dedication, commitment, and loyalty to her university field hockey team both on and off the playing field.

9.4.2 CRITERIA

- A player who, through example, both on and off the field, is an inspiration to her teammates in their pursuit of excellence in field hockey, in academics, and in their personal lives.
- A player whose leadership and performance has been instrumental in the overall performance of her team.
- A player who exemplifies the conduct and decorum expected of U SPORTS field hockey student-athletes.

9.4.3 SELECTION PROCESS

The names of the two Sport Conference’s winners plus additional biographical



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information shall be forwarded to the Awards Committee during the conference call to determine the All-Stars, voting shall take place to determine the award winners according to the following procedure:

1. Each voter shall rank the two nominees
2. The player with the most 1st place votes shall be the winner.

9.5 COACH OF THE YEAR (MARINA VAN DER MERWE AWARD)

9.5.1 Same process as for All-Star selections

9.5.2 The Coach of the Year Award will be selected using the following criteria:

1. Demonstrated a proven capacity throughout the season to improve competitive performance.
2. Presents a positive public image of coaching and the role of the coach.
3. Participates regularly in the National Coaching Certification Program.
4. Demonstrated concern for the all-round development of their athletes.
5. Showed respect for officials, opponents, parents, and espoused a philosophy of fair play.
6. Actively involved in coaching development.
7. Actively pursuing professional development; and
8. To win the National award the coach must have won the Coach of the Year award in their Sport Conference, if such an award exists.

9.6 COACHING SERVICE AWARD

9.6.1 Presented by the Coaches Association.

9.6.2 Presented to coaches with 10 years (or more) of service.

9.7 OFFICIAL OF THE YEAR AWARD

9.7.1 Presented by the Coaches Association.

9.7.2 Each Sport Conference will nominate an Umpire of the Year to go forward to the Awards Chair.

9.7.3 If possible, the umpire should have umpired at least 4 league games or umpired FIH or FHC games and have a minimum requirement of Regional Level certification.



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9.8 CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY (MCCRAE CUP) & U SPORTS INVITATIONAL BANNER

Presented to the U SPORTS Invitational Championship Team.

9.9 CHAMPIONSHIP MEDALS

Presented to the top three teams in the U SPORTS Invitational Championship.

9.10 CHAMPIONSHIP MVP

9.10.1 Tournament Eleven MVP - player receiving the most points.

9.10.2 In the event of a tie, a review of the numbers of top votes will determine the winner.

9.11 CHAMPIONSHIP ALL-STAR TEAM

9.11.1 Each participating coach shall nominate the players from his/her team who is considered worthy of Tournament Eleven selection. A submission form will be provided by the Host (Appendix I) to the teams and the deadline for submission is **Friday after the final game**. The form will be handed in to the Technical Table.

9.11.2 The Awards Chairperson will compile the coach’s list of nominees and circulate back to the coaches on Saturday morning.

9.11.3 From the list of nominees, each coach will select eleven players and submit a list of those players in rank order to the Awards Chairperson by end of the day on Saturday (Appendix 2). Players nominated to the Tournament Eleven shall receive rank order points: eleven (11) for first down to one (1) for eleventh; and in addition, each player shall receive ten (10) points each time their name appears on the list. Coaches may not vote for their own athletes.

9.11.4 In the case of a tie on the Tournament Eleven, the Awards Chairperson will call an emergency coaches meeting. The coaches will then cast deciding votes until the tie is broken.

9.11.5 Tournament Eleven will be announced alphabetically.



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9.12 CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYERS OF THE GAME

9.12.1 One player from each team will be picked as the player of the game.

9.12.2 A designated committee or the Head Coaches of the participating teams will select the Player of the game for the opposing team.

9.13 FAIR PLAY AWARD (R.W. PUGH)

One player from one of the participating teams shall be selected.

The Host Committee shall ensure that those working at the technical table select this award.

10 COMMITTEES

10.1 CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

10.1.1 Role of the Committee

The Management Committee shall rule on all matters necessary for the championship to proceed and will, in addition, act as the Protest Committee during the Invitational Championship. The Management Committee shall apply U SPORTS Rules. The Management Committee may not, nor may any member, make an exception to any U SPORTS Rule or to a sanction imposed by U SPORTS. The Management Committee has no jurisdiction to consider or interpret U SPORTS Eligibility Regulations.

- a. Composition of the Management Committee shall be:
- Championship Convener
 - Technical Official (or designate from officials’ group)
 - President of the Coaches Association or designate.

A quorum shall require all four members, or their replacement.

- b. Disciplinary Action

If a member of the Management Committee was involved, directly or indirectly, in a decision or an interpretation of a U SPORTS Rule that is being appealed/protested to the Management Committee that member shall be excused from the Management Committee. In this event, the remaining



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members of the Management Committee have the authority to appoint as a replacement for the excused member an individual who is independent, unbiased and uninvolved in the matter in dispute. The decision regarding whether a member of the Management Committee should be excused and replaced lies solely with the Management Committee.

Notwithstanding the procedures described in U SPORTS policy 90.70.4.1.1, the U SPORTS Championship Management Committee shall have the authority to take interim on-the-spot measures to address minor code of conduct issues (inappropriate or unsportsmanlike conduct that is not criminal in nature) that arise at U SPORTS Championships, in a timely fashion and communicated with U SPORTS immediately. The record of the incident, including the interim measures taken to address it shall be copied to the Athletic Director(s) of the affected school(s), and the U SPORTS office and Discipline Committee.

It is the expectation of U SPORTS that persons representing Member institutions, and/or U SPORTS, at U SPORTS Championships will behave responsibly, and with propriety, and in accordance with the laws of the land.

10.2 JURY OF APPEAL (N/A)

10.3 DELEGATES

The Technical Delegate (individual responsible for coordinating all technical matters) has the authority to suspend any member of the team party for misbehaving during or after the match of the competition.

The Technical Delegate and Judges shall be present at each game and shall oversee all technical matters of the game.



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11 APPENDICES

11.1 APPENDIX 1 – Tie Breaking Procedures for Pool Play

At the end of pool play, the total number of points accumulated during pool play will determine the team standings.

If Two Teams are tied: the following protocol shall determine the final pool standings:

- a. The team that has the best win/lost record in games between the two teams.
- b. If still tied, the team that has the best goals for minus the goals against record in games between the two teams.
- c. If still tied, the team that has the best goals for minus goals against record in all pool games.

Three or More Teams Tied: the following protocol shall be used to determine the higher ranked team from the tied teams:

- a. The team that has the best win/lost record in games between the three or more tied teams.
- b. If all teams are still tied, the team that has the best goals for minus the goals against record in pool games between the three or more tied teams.
- c. If all teams are still tied, the team that has the best goals for minus goals against record in all pool games.

Note: The above protocol is repeated until the number of tied teams is reduced to two. The ‘two teams tied protocol’ is then applied to break the final tie.
